Guidance for Facilitators

Objective: Provide an opportunity for participants to share their perspectives so that their ideas are incorporated into the larger vision for aligning outcome measures across federal programs that promote economic mobility.

Structure

Discussion Questions

- 1. What outcomes related to economic mobility are most important to measure consistently across federal employment and training and human services programs? Why?
- 2. A primary message from last week's state panel was to not let the quest for perfect data or metrics impede progress towards aligning outcome measures for programs with similar goals. Recognizing that federal programs have to start somewhere, where would you begin?
- 3. A successful effort starts with a clear, strong vision. What do you see as the primary purpose for moving towards using consistent outcome measures across federal programs that promote economic mobility?
- 4. What existing innovative strategies for measuring and reporting outcomes across programs might yield lessons to inform federal efforts?
