



Discussion questions for Poverty and Covid-19:

What underlying inequities has the Covid-19 pandemic brought to light and exacerbated?

The pandemic has resulted in new groups of people accessing the social safety net; how might this exposure influence public opinion about public assistance in the future?

What systemic change needs has the pandemic revealed?
