Eligibility

- Ph.D.-holding, U.S.-based poverty scholar at any career level
- Meet the NIH definition of underrepresented in their field of study

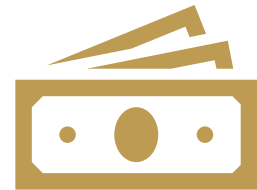

LOGISTICS OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Funding

- 4 scholars selected to visit a Poverty Center during the 2022 – 2023 academic year
- Funding covers:
 - Transportation
 - Lodging
 - Meals



Funding

LOGISTICS OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Application

- Complete **online Application Form**
- Upload as 1 pdf:
 - 2-page letter
 - describe poverty research interests and experiences
 - Indicate the CPC institutions that you are applying to (up to 3, ranked by preference)
 - CV
 - 2 examples of poverty-related written materials

LOGISTICS OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Timeline

- May 17, 2022: Deadline for proposal receipt
- July 1, 2022: Notification of award
- 2022-2023 Academic Year: Dates for Visit (flexible)

- Explain how your research aligns with the expertise of the faculty
- Be sure the faculty are at that institution
